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- Users with network access shall not utilize district resources to establish electronic mail accounts 1
- 2 through third-party providers or any other nonstandard electronic mail system. All data including e-

- Employees/students have no expectation of privacy with regards to such data. E-mail correspondence 4
- may be a public record under the public records law and may be subject to public inspection.³ 5
