To meet the requirements for graduation, a student shall have attained an approved attendance, conduct and subject
 matter record which covers a planned program of education, and such record shall be kept on file in the high
 school.

The program of studies shall include areas and content in these areas within State Board of Education Regulations
and shall be flexible enough to facilitate progress from one stage of development to another, thus providing for
more effective student adjustment.

7 The pattern of courses which shall be required of all students in grades nine (9) through twelve (12) shall be in
8 accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the State Board of Education and the Board of Education.

9 Before graduation, every student shall [1] achieve the specified units of credit; [2] take the required end of course
exams;⁵ [3] have satisfactory records of attendance and conduct, [4] Complete an ACT and [5] Pass a United
States civic test.³

So that students are on-track to graduate, struggling students shall be identified as early as possible in the school year, by means of student information system, progress reports and phone calls. Parents shall be notified when areas of concern are identified and shall be informed periodically of remedial efforts and progress. Schools will notify parent/guardians in writing, as soon as possible, to inform them that their student's participation in graduation ceremonies are in jeopardy.

17 Special Education Students^{1, 4}

Special education students who successfully complete their Individualized Educational Program (IEP), pass the required competency assessment and have satisfactory records of attendance and conduct shall be awarded a regular diploma. A special education diploma⁵ shall be awarded to students who have satisfactorily completed their IEP and who have satisfactory records of attendance and conduct, completed four years of high school, but who have not met the proficiency testing requirements.

23 Occupational Diploma

Special education students who do not meet the requirements for a high school diploma may be awarded an
 occupational diploma if the student has:⁵

- 26 1. satisfactorily completed their IEP;
- 27 2. maintained satisfactory records of attendance and conduct;
- 28 3. completed the occupational diploma Skills, Knowledge, and Experience Mastery Assessment (SKEMA);
- 29 4. completed at least four (4) years of high school; and
- 30 5. has two (2) years of paid or non-paid work experience.

The decision to attain an occupational diploma shall be made at the conclusion of the student's tenth (10th) grade year, or two (2) academic years prior to the expected graduation date. Students who have received an occupational

- 1 diploma shall continue to make progress towards a high school diploma until the end of the school year in which
- 2 they turn twenty-two (22) years old.
- 3 Alternate Academic Diploma

Special education students who do not meet the requirements for a high school diploma may be awarded and
 alternate academic diploma if the student has:⁴

- 6 1. Completed at least four years of high school
- 7 2. Participated in the high school alternate assessment;
- 8 3. Earned the prescribed number of minimum credits;
- 9 4. Made satisfactory progress on their IEP;
- 10 5. Maintained satisfactory records of attendance and conduct; and
- 6. Completed a transition assessment that measures postsecondary education and training, employment,
 interdependent living and community involvement.

13 STUDENT LOAD

- 14 All full time students in grades 9-12 shall be enrolled each semester in subjects that produce a minimum of five
- units of credit for graduation per year. Students with hardships and gifted students may appeal this requirement to
- 16 the director of schools and then to the Board.⁶
